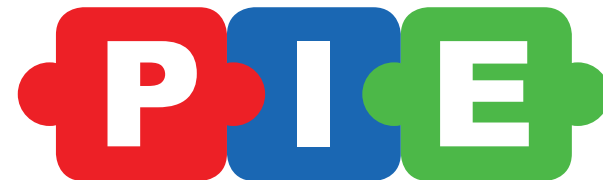

What is PIE's

• *Vinalhaven College Scholarship?*

Established in Spring 2006 by Partners in Island Education, the *Vinalhaven College Scholarship (VCS)* is awarded annually to a graduating senior who plans to attend a four-year college full-time. Applicants are considered primarily for their academic achievement, school and community involvement, personal statement of goals, recommendations, and the strength of their family's connection to Vinalhaven and/or their intention to benefit the community in the future. This scholarship is not primarily need-based but financial information is reviewed. SAT scores and class rank are not considered. The *Vinalhaven College Scholarship* is an award of \$2,000, renewable for each of a student's four years in college. This year, thanks to a very generous donation in memory of Astrid and Wyman Philbrook, PIE is able to award a second *Vinalhaven College Scholarship*.

What is PIE's

• *Ogden/Chaffey Scholarship?*

Established in Spring 2010 with a generous donation from Ms. Mary Jean Ogden, a long-time summer resident of Vinalhaven, PIE's *Ogden/Chaffey Scholarship (OCS)* started as a one-time award of \$500 and has increased several times, thanks to additional donations by Ms. Ogden. The *Ogden/Chaffey Scholarship* is awarded to students attending a 1- or 2-year post-secondary school or vocational program. Applicants are considered primarily for their exemplary community and volunteer activities, and work experience. Academic achievement, school activities, recommendations and personal goals are also considered but given less emphasis. If no students in a given year plan to attend a 1- or 2-year post-secondary school or vocational program, the Scholarship is awarded to a qualified student attending a 4-year school.

Application Criteria for

• *Vinalhaven College Scholarship* • *Ogden/Chaffey Scholarship*

Applicants to both Scholarships submit:

- Application Form
- Financial Information Form
- Resume
- High School Transcript

Note: Students awarded a Scholarship who decide to take time off from school at any point, or to change college programs, are asked to submit a statement explaining their new plans, with the understanding that their eligibility for the Scholarship will be reconsidered in light of the new information.
